


## Airtable Overview

## Novel Planning

Use these starter bases to get a jump start on your project. For inspiration from community-published bases, check out Universe.

When it's time to channel your inner Tolkien, use this novel writing template to build and remember every detail of your invented world. Whether you're planning a short story or sketching a road-map for an entire novel, this template can be personalized to fit your needs.

Make brainstorming easy when you store your character sketches, scene ideas, and worldbuilding ideas in one place. Access your template on mobile to add backstory to your main characters and deepen your world's mythology on the go.

Perfectly designed for the Snowflake Method, the list format makes it easy to jot down the bare bones of each new idea, while the expandable cells let you flesh them out with as many little details as your muse gives you. Link minor characters to the scenes you plan to use them in, then flesh them out later as needed. Drag and drop individual entries to make the order of your planned scenes match with your timeline, and easily move them back if you change your mind.

Side benefit: armed with your novel planning database, you can now convince your
